





Variety	Bloom Time	Approx. Ripening	Scab Resistance	Fruit & Flavor	Tips	Pollination
 <b>Akane</b> <small>Jonathon x Worcester Permain</small>	Mid/ Late	Early/Mid Sept	Resistant	Round, bright red fruit; Firm, crisp & juicy; excellent sweet/sharp flavor	Great for fresh eating! Early season apple doesn't store well but holds well on the tree. AKA Tokyo Rose.	Pollinate with any other apple on this list <b>EXCEPT</b> Ashmead's, Gravenstein, King, Mutsu
 <b>Ashmead's Kernel</b>	Late	October	Resistant	Small to medium, yellow to brown sometimes bumpy fruit; Sweet tart, nutty flavor.	An old variety from England; Highly-rated for sweet sharp flavor; great for cider, dessert; decent storage.	<b>Will not pollinate other apples!</b> Pollinate with any other mid/late bloom apple <b>EXCEPT</b> Ashmead's, Gravenstein, King, Mutsu
 <b>Beni Shogun Fuji</b> <small>Sport of Fuji</small>	Mid	October	Moderate Resistance	Bright pinkish red; crisp, juicy, very sweet Japanese apple, decent keeper	Fresh, sauce & cooking apple. This Fuji has the best chance of ripening in our area.	Pollinate with any other apple on this list <b>EXCEPT</b> Ashmead's, Gravenstein, King, Mutsu
 <b>Calville Blanc</b>	Mid/ Late	Late October	Susceptible	Med-size, bell-pepper shaped; green skin w/blush; flavorful w/banana-like aroma	Gourmet culinary apple of France; Excellent for sauce, cooking, dessert; Good keeper; more Vit-C than an orange.	Pollinate with any other apple on this list <b>EXCEPT</b> Ashmead's, Gravenstein, King, Mutsu
 <b>Chehalis</b> <small>Golden Delicious Seedling</small>	Early/ Mid	Mid/Late Sept	Resistant	Greenish-yellow, large fruit; sweet, juicy, crisp, slightly acidic	Fresh eating if you wait till it's sweet enough; good for baking and cider; similar to Golden Delicious but crisper	Pollinate with any other apple on this list <b>EXCEPT</b> Ashmead's, Gravenstein, King, Mutsu
 <b>Cortland</b> <small>McIntosh x Ben Davis</small>	Mid	Mid Sept/ Oct	Susceptible	Dark red, white flesh resists browning; tart, tangy, juicy	McIntosh type apple great for fresh eating and pretty much everything else!	Pollinate with any other apple on this list <b>EXCEPT</b> Ashmead's, Gravenstein, King, Mutsu
 <b>CosmicCrisp®</b> <small>Enterprise x Honeycrisp</small>	Mid/ Late	Late Sept/ Early Oct	Resistant	Large, bright red, juicy, sweet, sharp, firm Fresh eating & cooking.	High sugar content. Stores well. Flesh does not brown easily. From WSU. Only plant in WA state.	Pollinate with any other apple on this list <b>EXCEPT</b> Ashmead's, Gravenstein, King, Mutsu
 <b>Cox's Orange Pippin</b>	Early/ Mid	Late Sept	Susceptible	Yellow with orange-red blush; medium-sized, crisp, aromatic w/ hints of orange & mango.	Antique variety from England. Superb fresh, pies, sauce, cider; stores well.	Pollinate with any other apple on this list <b>EXCEPT</b> Ashmead's, Gravenstein, King, Mutsu
 <b>Empire</b> <small>Red Delicious x McIntosh</small>	Mid/ Late	Sept/Oct	Susceptible	Maroon-red fruit with lighter green. Sweet and crunchy.	McIntosh type . Great for fresh eating, sauce, baking, pies.	Pollinate with any other apple on this list <b>EXCEPT</b> Ashmead's, Gravenstein, King, Mutsu
 <b>Enterprise</b> <small>Golden Delicious, McIntosh, Rome Beauty</small>	Mid/ Late	Late October	Immune	Bright glossy, red & yellow fruit; rich, spritely flavor mellows w/age	Good for fresh eating and cooking; great disease resistance; stores well.	Pollinate with any other apple on this list <b>EXCEPT</b> Ashmead's, Gravenstein, King, Mutsu
 <b>Golden Sentinel</b>	Mid	Early October	Susceptible	Large, golden yellow; sweet & juicy	Great <b>columnar</b> apple for limited space or patio/containers; stores well.	Pollinate with any other apple on this list <b>EXCEPT</b> Ashmead's, Gravenstein, King, Mutsu
 <b>Gravenstein</b>	Early	Early September	Susceptible	Large, yellow with red stripes; aromatic, crisp, juicy and tangy	Old favorite, excellent for cooking/baking. Tends to bear alternate years. Keeps about 3 weeks	<b>Will not pollinate other apples!</b> Pollinate with any other early/mid bloom apple <b>EXCEPT</b> Ashmead's, Gravenstein, King, Mutsu
 <b>Honeycrisp</b> <small>Keepsake</small>	Mid/ Late	October	Resistant	Medium sized, mottled red over yellow fruit; very crisp, sweet & juicy	Excellent for fresh eating, also cooking, stores well	Pollinate with any other apple on this list <b>EXCEPT</b> Ashmead's, Gravenstein, King, Mutsu
 <b>King</b>	Mid/ Late	October	Susceptible	Large red/yellow striped fruit; Firm, crisp & juicy; Aromatic & sweet.	Another old-timer; good all-purpose apple; stores well	<b>Will not pollinate other apples!</b> Pollinate with any other mid/late bloom apple <b>EXCEPT</b> Ashmead's, Gravenstein, King, Mutsu

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 <b>Liberty</b> <small>Macoun x Purdue</small>	Early/ Mid	Early October	Immune	Medium size red fruit; crisp & juicy, tart McIntosh type	Heavy fruit set results in small apples, so plan on doing some thinning. Stores well.	Pollinate with any other apple on this list <b>EXCEPT</b> Ashmead's, Gravenstein, King, Mutsu
 <b>Lodi</b> <small>Montgomery x Yellow Transparent</small>	Early/ Mid	August	Resistant	Large yellow fruit; Crisp & juicy; good sharp, tangy flavor.	One of the first apples to ripen; best for cooking, juice, sauces. Stores well.	Pollinate with any other early/mid bloom apple <b>EXCEPT</b> Ashmead's, Gravenstein, King, Mutsu
 <b>Maslin (Early Pink Lady)</b>	Mid	October	Susceptible	Red blushed fruit with crisp dense flesh; sweet/tart flavor	Late ripening; but an early ripening selection from the 'Pink Lady' family of apples. Great for fresh eating.	Pollinate with any other apple on this list <b>EXCEPT</b> Ashmead's, Gravenstein, King, Mutsu
 <b>Melrose</b> <small>Jonathan x Red Delicious</small>	Mid/ Late	October	Susceptible	Large russeted yellow-green with fiery red skin. Crisp, juicy, slightly tart/acidic	One of the best keepers as flavor improves with storage. Great for sauces and baking.	Pollinate with any other apple on this list <b>EXCEPT</b> Ashmead's, Gravenstein, King, Mutsu
 <b>Mutsu</b> <small>Gold Delicious x Indo</small>	Mid	October	Susceptible	Large, round, golden fruit; Distinctive spicy, sweet flavor; Crunchy & juicy	aka 'Crispin'; Originates from Japan. Fresh eating, sauce, dessert & cider; stores well.	<b>Will not pollinate other apples!</b> Pollinate with any other apple on this list <b>EXCEPT</b> Ashmead's, Gravenstein, King, Mutsu
 <b>North pole</b>	Mid	Late Sept	Susceptible	Medium to large bright red fruit; crisp & juicy	Great <b>columnar</b> apple for limited space or patio/containers. McIntosh type.	Pollinate with any other apple on this list <b>EXCEPT</b> Ashmead's, Gravenstein, King, Mutsu
 <b>Pink Pearl</b>	Early	August	Susceptible	Bright pink flesh beneath pearly-yellow skin. Rich sweet-tart flavor.	Highly ornamental crimson-pink blossoms! Colorful sauce, desserts; Does not store well.	Pollinate with any other early/mid bloom apple <b>EXCEPT</b> Ashmead's, Gravenstein, King, Mutsu
 <b>Pristine</b> <small>McIntosh x Rome x Gold Delicious</small>	Mid/ Late	August	Immune	Lemon yellow fruit; mild tart flavor, crisp & tasty	Early ripening, productive tree, stores well; good fresh, for baking or sauce	Pollinate with any other apple on this list <b>EXCEPT</b> Ashmead's, Gravenstein, King, Mutsu
 <b>Rosey Glow</b>	Mid	August/Sept	Susceptible	Bright red fruit with a yellow blush	Good early apple found in a field in Marysville, great for fresh eating and cooking.	Pollinate with any other apple on this list <b>EXCEPT</b> Ashmead's, Gravenstein, King, Mutsu
 <b>Scarlet Sentinel</b>	Early/ Mid	Late Sept	Susceptible	Green with red blush fruit; crisp, juicy & sweet.	Great <b>columnar</b> apple for patio/container gardens; most dwarf of the columnar types; Stores well.	Pollinate with any other apple on this list <b>EXCEPT</b> Ashmead's, Gravenstein, King, Mutsu
 <b>Spartan</b> <small>McIntosh x Newton Pippin</small>	Mid	October	Resistant	Small size dark red fruit; crisp juicy, firm w/fine sweet flavor	McIntosh type, great fresh, more firm. Heavy producer so thinning fruit is advised. Stores well.	Pollinate with any other apple on this list <b>EXCEPT</b> Ashmead's, Gravenstein, King, Mutsu
 <b>Whitney Crabapple</b>	Mid	July to August	Resistant	Round red, golf ball size fruit; sweet, juicy, yellow flesh.	Self fertile and a good apple pollinizer. Heavy bearer; great for canning, preserves, pickling.	<b>Self-fertile; no pollinizer required.</b>
 <b>William's Pride</b> <small>Jonathan x Rome Beauty</small>	Early/ Mid	August	Resistant	Medium sized, mottled red over yellow fruit; very crisp, sweet & juicy	Excellent for fresh eating, also stores well	Pollinate with any other apple on this list <b>EXCEPT</b> Ashmead's, Gravenstein, King, Mutsu
 <b>Zestar!</b> <small>State Fair x MN 1691</small>	Early	August	Susceptible	Medium sized, red striped; Crisp & juicy; sweet & tangy flavor	Nice early apple, stores well. Fresh eating and cooking. From the U. of Minnesota.	Pollinate with any other early/mid bloom apple <b>EXCEPT</b> Ashmead's, Gravenstein, King, Mutsu
