Early season apple doesn't store well but holds well on the tree. AKA Tokyo Rose.	Pollinate with any other apple on this list EXCEPT triploid varieties: Bramley,Gravenstein, King, Mutsu
Bramley (dwarf)	Late	Early October	Scab & mildew resistant	Large tart, green/ yellow fruit with intense sweet-sour flavor	Fruit is firm & juicy that is excellent in pies, tarts & sauces. Very high in phytonutrients.	Triploid variety with sterile pollen. Will NOT pollinate other apples. Pollinate with any other mid-late bloom apples
Chehalis Golden Delicious Seedling (available dwarf & semi)	Early/ Mid	Mid/Late Sept	Resistant	Greenish-yellow, large fruit; sweet, juicy, crisp, slightly acidic	Fresh eating if you wait till it's sweet enough; good for baking and cider; similar to Golden Delicious but crisper	Pollinate with any other apple on this list EXCEPT Bramley, Gravenstein, King, Mutsu
Cosmic Crisp® Enterprise X Honeycrisp (available dwarf & semi)	Mid/ Late	Late Sept/ Early Oct	Resistant	bred & grown in WA State, Large, juicy, red apple; balanced flavor; firm texture	Fresh eating, cooking, baking	Pollinate with another mid-late blooming variety
Dolgo Crabapple	Early mid- season	Late Aug/ Early Sept	Resistant	1 1/2" crimson fruit, highly flavored like candied cranberry	Ideal for canning & preserving whole. A fair keeper	Self-fertile. No pollinator required.
Fuji	Mid	Late Sept/ October	Susceptible	Intensely sweet, like honey or apple juice, refreshing, mild tartness and subtle citrus notes	They maintain their shape and don't get mushy, making them great for pies, sauces, and roasting.	Pollinate with another mid-blooming variety such as Gala, Golden or Red Delicious, Honeycrisp
Gala	Early/ mid	Sept/Oct	Susceptible	Originally from NZ; crisp, sweet, slightly floral	Early Spring is the <i>critical time</i> for scab infection. Cleaning up leaves from beneath trees helps prevent scab.	Pollinate with another variety that flower around the same time.
Golden Sentinel®	Mid	Early October	Susceptible	Large, golden yellow; sweet & juicy	Great columnar apple for limited space/containers; stores well.	Pollinate with any other apple on this list. EXCEPT Bramley, Gravenstein, King, Mutsu
Gravenstein	Early	Early September	Susceptible	Large, yellow with red stripes; aromatic, crisp, juicy and tangy	Old favorite, excellent for cooking/baking. Tends to bear alternate years. Keeps about 3 weeks	Triploid variety with sterile pollen. Will NOT pollinate other apple trees.
Honeycrisp (dwarf) Keepsake X MN1627	Mid	Late September	Scab & fire blight resistant	Large, crunchy, crisp red apple. Juicy sweet -tart when picked.	Mellows to full-bodied flavor. Good keeper. Winter hardy to -40°F.	Pollinate with any other apple on this list EXCEPT Bramley, Gravenstein, King, Mutsu

Maslin® Pink Lady	Early	Late Sept/Oct	Some susceptibility	Sweet-tart balance with a crisp, firm texture and an effervescent, citrusy tang with subtle honey notes	excellent for fresh eating, baking (holding shape well), and salads	Pollinate with another apple with similar bloom time
Mutsu	Mid	Mid October	Susceptible	Very large, yellow-green sweet-tart honey-flavored apple. Firm, crisp & juicy;	Excellent fresh or cooked into pies. Parent: Golden Delicious	Triploid variety with sterile pollen. Will not pollinate other apple trees.
Northpole™® Colunade	Mid/Late	September	Resistant	Large, bright red, crunchy, McIntosh apple. Crisp, juicy, sweet and aromatic	Cider, baking, eating fresh. Ideal for containers on a patio, or as a small tree in the ground.	Pollinate with another apple with similar bloom time
Pink Pearl (dwarf)	Early/mid	Late Aug	Some susceptibility	Unique distinctive pink flesh beneath translucent, pearly yellow skin. Sweet-tart flavor, bright acidity & notes of raspberry/cherry hints of grapefruit	Excellent in tarts, sauces, and preserves, where the pink color remains visible	Pollinate with another apple with similar bloom time
Pristine Mcintosh x Rome x Gold Delicious	Early/Mid	August	Immune	Lemon yellow fruit; mild tart flavor, crisp & tasty	Early ripening, productive tree, stores well; good fresh, for baking or sauce	Pollinate with any other apple on this list, EXCEPT Bramley, Gravenstein, King, Mutsu
Spartan	Mid	October	Resistant	sweet-tart, juicy flavor with a hint of wine-like notes	Excellent dessert apple for fresh eating, salads, or baking	Pollinate with another apple with similar bloom time
Combo 4-Way	Early/Mid		Yes	Varieties may include: Sunrise Magic, Chehalis, Honeycrisp, Cosmic Crisp, Gravenstein		
Espalier Gala	Early/mid	Sept/Oct	Susceptible	Firm yet juicy; mildly sweet, fresh, & fruity; hints of honey, vanilla, & pear; not overly tart	Eating fresh, pairing with cheese, ; baking	Pollinate with another variety that flower near the same time.
Espalier Honeycrisp	Mid	Late September	Scab & fire blight resistant	Large, crunchy, crisp red apple. Juicy sweet-tart when picked.	Mellows to full-bodied flavor. Good keeper. Winter hardy to -40°F.	Pollinate with any other apple on this list EXCEPT Bramley, Gravenstein, King, Mutsu
