PEACH

Variety	Pollination	Approx. Harvest	Description	Disease Resistance
Bonanza (Miniature)	Self-fertile	Mid-late summer	Medium-to-large, yellow flesh and yellow skin blushed with red. Freestone. Prolific! Grows ~5-6 feet tall. Good fresh, canning or baking. Needs 450 chill hours.	Somewhat resistant to peach leaf curl. Preventatively spray with copper fungicide 2 to 3 times during the winter.
Frost®	Self-fertile	Mid-late August	Med-large fruit, yellow flesh with yellow fruit, semi-freestone. Prolific when conditions are right. Good eaten fresh, fair for canning.	Somewhat Peach leaf curl resistant
Pix Zee (Miniature)	Self-fertile	Early-mid-season.	Large, sweet, flavorful, orange-red; yellow flesh. Freestone. Grows 5-6' tall. Good for containers. Needs 400 chill hours.	Good cultural controls—good drainage and air circulation—to reduce disease issues.
Saturn	Self-fertile	Late-July-August	Uniquely shaped like a donut; very sweet, yellow fruit and white flesh.	Disease-resistant to bacterial leaf-spot.

APRICOT

Puget Gold®	Self-fertile	August	Developed in Western Washington. Easiest to grow and most disease resistant apricot available. Sweet, rich full flavor.	To help prevent disease problems, spray with copper in fall, in winter and early spring during dry spells.

APRIUM

Flavor De-light	Self-fertile	June -July	This hybrid is 3/4 apricot and 1/4 plum. Yellow, firm flesh similar to an apricot. Flavor is a blend of apricot and plum flavor.	Susceptible
Leah Cot	Self-fertile	Mid-June–July	This hybrid has a rich, sweet flavor with a hint of tanginess. Medium-sized fruit; golden-orange skin and a smooth, tender texture. Ideal for fresh eating, baking, or preserving. Good choice for cooler climates.	Susceptible; resistant to powder mildew

PLUERRY

Candy Heart	Pollinate with Sweet Treat Pluerry or Burgundy Plum	Mid-August	A cross between a plum and a sweet cherry. Skin is dark speckled red, flesh is amber/red wonderful unique flavor.	Susceptible
Sugar Twist <i>Prunus x 'Sweet Treat'</i>	Reliably pollinated with any early blooming Asian	July – August	One of the newest in interspecific plum cherry hybrids and has intensely sweet flavor. Sugar Twist™ is unique for its very early harvests, about a month earlier than Sweet Treat. Fruit has red skin with amber flesh and the sugar sweet taste of a ripe cherry with the twist of plum.	Susceptible
Sweet Treat <i>Prunus x sweet cherry</i>	Reliably pollinated by another mid-season blooming Asian plum or Flavor King Pluot.	September	The first interspecific cross created by a complex interspecific hybrid, predominantly of plum and cherry, combining the sweetness of a cherry with a fresh plum zing. Crimson red skin, amber flesh and a small, clingstone pit.	Susceptible

PLUOT

Flavor King	Pollinate with Candy Heart Pluerry, or other mid-late flowering Asian variety	Mid-August	Taste test winner. Unique plum-apricot hybrid with sensational bouquet and sweet, spicy flavor. Reddish-purple skin, crimson flesh.	Susceptible
